## Critical Information

**Check In:** Check in opens at 4:00 PM on November 18<sup>th</sup>.

The following is REQUIRED upon Check-in:

- Check-in Registration form
- Medical forms
- Covid-19 Pass for all attendees
- Copy of Troop Roster

### Registration Fee

(Scouts and Leaders are the same fee.)

<b>Registration Opens</b> October 3, 2022	<b>Registration Closes</b> November 4, 2022
<b>\$20.00 per Attendee</b>	<b>NO registration after Nov 4</b>

**Vehicles:** Vehicle free campground will be upheld. Once your vehicle has been unloaded, you will be required to remove it from the camping area. A location has been designated for parking of vehicles during the Camporee. NO vehicles will remain in the camping area.

**Campsites:** Campsites will be assigned as you arrive. Bring your own tents and ground covers. No trenching or other digging is permitted at Cub Adventure Camp. Camp stoves are permitted.

**Campfires:** At this point in time, campfires are permitted in the campsites in a fire barrel or fire ring. Propane stoves are approved. All ashes must be removed from the camp. If there is a change, you will be notified when you check in. Fire wood is available at the Camporee.

**Cracker Barrel:** Cracker Barrel is at 9:00 PM at Headquarters. SPL or ASPL and Scoutmasters, should arrive at HQ promptly at 9:00 PM to discuss Camporee details. SPL or ASPL will then return to their units to brief patrols with the information from the Cracker Barrel. Camporee Staff should also attend Cracker Barrel.

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- First Aid:** First aid kits are required to be visibly posted at each campsite. During the events, a Camp first aid station will be set up at a designated location. Be very aware of your surroundings as there may be snakes, and others creatures in the area.
- Water:** Each troop should bring water; however, there are water spigots available.
- Leadership:** All units are required to have at least two registered adult leaders on site, at all times. All units should utilize the patrol method in accordance with BSA standards.
- Inspections:** Campsite inspections will be performed during the day on Saturday. (see attached form on page 9.)
- Patrol Flag:** Each patrol should bring a patrol flag.
- Uniforms:** Class A uniforms are requested to be worn for the following events; namely, upon arrival and Sunday worship/awards ceremony. Class B uniforms can be worn for all other activities.
- Checkout:** SPL or ASPL are to report to HQ and request a check out inspection. Once the inspection is passed, paperwork will be returned to the unit. Please remove all trash from your campsites!
- Patches:** Camporee patches will be presented to all paid attendees and will be included with the camporee check out on Sunday.
- Awards:** Awards will be given out Sunday morning after the religious service.
- Skits:** Come prepared with a NEW & ORIGINAL skit! All attending units will be expected to present skits, songs or run-ons in the Lord Baden Powell tradition!

### Skills

In order for your scouts to compete on a level playing field, it is important that they comply with the items below:

1. Each scout **MUST** know how read and use a compass.
2. Each scout **MUST** know the following knots: clove hitch, two half hitches and lashings
3. Each scout **MUST** have their bandana with them. It will be needed on one of the events.
4. One event is **SLING SHOT!** All scouts wishing to participate in this event **MUST** bring their own slingshot. Ammunition will be provided.

Part of the Patrol's grade will be based on how well they demonstrate the use of the Patrol Method.

Other competitions available to each unit:

- A. Troop's camp site inspection
- B. Cook food in a solar oven, hobo oven, box oven or an open fire. Ovens will be judged during the Troop's campsite inspection.
- C. Dutch oven cooked dessert – desserts will be judged at dinner.

### Dutch Oven Cooking

- Dutch Oven Bread/Dessert Contest - Patrols that would like to participate, should bring Dutch Oven cooked bread or desserts to the Camporee Staff to judge on Saturday during dinner time. The Staff will be at the Administration Building for judging.
